Privacy and Data Protection Statement

Twyford & District Fishing Club (TDFC) is a privacy conscious organisation and is strongly committed to its member's right to privacy.

How does the Data Protection Act affect the records kept by TDFC?

The Data Protection Act states that those who record and process personal information must be open about how the information is used and must follow the eight principles of 'good information handling'. These principles state that data must be:

- Fairly and lawfully processed.
- Processed for limited purposes.
- Adequate, relevant and not excessive.
- Accurate.
- Not kept for longer than is necessary.
- Processed in line with your rights.
- Secure.
- Not transferred to countries without adequate protection.

By law, organizations have to keep to these principles. If you believe in any way that TDFC is not processing your personal data in accordance with these principles, please contact the TDFC Membership Secretary.

How does TDFC collect data?

TDFC collects personal data through application forms, renewal forms, membership surveys and occasionally via email or telephone. All personally identifiable information provided to TDFC is processed in accordance with the principles of the Data Protection Act 1998.

Is information passed to third parties?

TDFC only disclose information to third parties if explicitly required to do so by UK law. TDFC will obtain your consent before passing on any information to any third parties. TDFC does not collect or compile personally identifying information for dissemination or sale to external parties for marketing purposes

Who is allowed to see my information?

All records held by TDFC will only be made visible to active TDFC committee members with a need for that information.

Cookies

A cookie will be stored on the member's computer if the "Remember me" option is selected when logging onto the Members area of the club website. The cookie will only contain the members email address.
